The Season of Creation: 1st September- 4 October.

Given the experience of the lockdown I think we are all more aware of how inter-connected and vulnerable the world is. In the days of little vehicular movement how clean and less polluted the air was; how nature sprang to life, and birds sang so beautifully to us. The coming season gives us an opportunity to pray, reflect and express our care for our planet, our 'Common Home.' The season runs to 4th October, the Feast day of St Francis of Assisi.

In his message for **Laudato Si** week in May this year, Bishop Mark said 'Our earth is the home for the human family. It is in severe danger and needs immediate protection and healing at a global, national and local level. The threatened state of the environment is a universal challenge affecting us all; those most in danger at present, and in the future, are those who are already poor and vulnerable. **Laudato Si** is permeated by a sense of human, moral and religious urgency, but Pope Francis recognises the complexity of the joining of the environment and poverty. "We are not faced," he says "with two separate crises, one environmental and the other social but rather with one complex crisis which is both social and environmental(139) Our diocese invites everyone to reflect, to pray and to act, so that we achieve that ecological conversion that the Holy Father calls us to. No Watch and Pray on Thursday 10th in Penzance.

PHASE 2 of our redevelopment in Penzance and the completion of the church, has begun.

The only access to the church now is the main door in Rosevean Road. Use the stairs at the side of the Presbytery to get to Rosevean Road. Access to the outside toilet will still be via the main ramp and side church door, but not possible from the car park.

Face Coverings: Government decrees: From 8th August face coverings are mandatory in all places of worship. All those attending must wear a face covering unless exempt from doing so. This is for the good of all who gather in Church for Mass as it is an enclosed public space. The face covering should cover both mouth and nose.

PLEASE NOTE IN ALL CHURCHES KNEELERS NOT TO BE USED.

Readers should remove their face coverings at the Lectern to read, and should replace them before stepping away.

Helpful Mask Advice at Holy Communion time:

When removing your mask to consume the Sacred Host please remember to slip the elastic off one ear and return it again without touching the front of the mask with your hand. Touching the part of the mask that you are breathing through with your hand is where you are at most risk of picking up and then passing on the virus to surfaces that other people will also touch. Please replace face covering, having consumed the Host before moving back to your pew in an orderly manner.

Confessions/Reconciliation: Our confessionals are not very user friendly because of social distancing, but with mask in Penzance we can use it. The easiest is to make a phone appointment, and we can arrange to meet either in church when empty or outside. For Canon David still use Presbytery phone and arrangements can be made.

Mary's Meals: In the midst of the pandemic, it is good for us to remember the very great work that Mary's meals does for so many children who otherwise would starve from hunger. Live Organ Donation. A repeat from earlier information that the law on donation of your organs after death has changed in May 2020. Previously you had to give consent for this to happen. Now it will happen automatically unless you choose to opt out. To do that you have to register to say no. You can register on line, just google organ donation.
