A busy, liturgically speaking weekend. The weekend before All Saints, if the date is not known is kept as the **Dedication Festival:** Ours happily coincide: Penzance 177 years, St Ives 112 years and Hayle 62 years. If we could sing there would be Dedication hymns. No congregational singing so the readings will be those of the 30th Sunday.

A **Dedication Festival** is important because as the Preface of the Mass says, 'For in this visible house that you have let us build and where you never cease to show favour to the family on pilgrimage to you in this place, you wonderfully manifest and accomplish the mystery of your communion with us. Here you build up for yourself the temple that we are and cause your Church, spread throughout the world to grow even more and more as the Lord's own body till she reaches her fullness in the vision of peace, the heavenly city of Jerusalem. And so, with the countless ranks of the blessed, in the temple of your glory we praise you, we bless you, and proclaim your greatness as we acclaim: Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts...'

This weekend also marks the 50th Anniversary of the Canonisation of the 40 Martyrs of England and Wales.

Given our close association with St Cuthbert Mayne, Bishop Mark has prepared a pastoral message, too long to be read, but copies are available, and is also on the Diocesan website.

All Saints day is next Sunday, all Masses of the Feast All Souls Day is Monday 2nd. A Private Requiem Mass will be offered at 8 a.m. as I am burying Sheila Holmes ashes in Longstone Cemetery at 9 a.m.

The Clergy Requiem, in the Cathedral on the 5th will only be for a few invited Clergy and Lay people. Each parish priest is asked to offer Mass that day at 12 noon in his own parish church. So on Thursday 5th **no Watch and Pray**, but Parish Requiem Mass at noon in Penzance.

Pope Francis: Fratelli Tutti, Brothers and Sisters. Catholic South West have a pull out supplement about this latest encyclical signed in Assisi on the feast of St Francis, and Bishop Mark issued a Pastoral message to the diocese about it on 4th October. Pope Francis reminds us that we all share a common fraternity, because we are all made in the image and likeness of God. Pope Francis shares with us a remarkable vision of what it means to live a social friendship with one another, not just those whom we meet on a day to day basis, but those who are far from us, whom we must take the risk of coming to know and embracing. COVID 19: At a recent General Audience Pope Francis said recently: 'In responding to the grave challenges caused by the present pandemic, we Christians are guided by the wisdom and strength born of the virtues of faith, hope and love. As God's gifts, these virtues heal us and enable us in turn to bring Christ's healing presence to our world. They can inspire in us a new and creative spirit to help us face today's deeply rooted physical, social and spiritual infirmities and change the unjust and destructive behaviour that threatens the future of our human family. Today the Church seeks to continue the Lord's healing ministry, not only to individuals but also to society as a whole. She does this by proposing a number of principles drawn from the Gospel, which include: the dignity of the human person, the common good, the preferential option for the poor, the universal destination of goods, solidarity, subsidiarity and the care of our common home.'

COVID Update. Public Health England have indicated they are not overly concerned about Places of Worship in terms of outbreak, as we are low to medium risk. Our Churches are safe. No room for complacency though. We all have a duty towards each other so the **HANDS – FACE- SPACE** mantra remains vital, and that we do not wander all over the Church, and touch as little as possible.. Carlo Acutis: <http://www.miracolieuucaristici.org/> Carlo was born in London of Italian parents in 1991, and later they went back to Italy, to Milan, when he was young. When Carlo made his First Holy Communion he subsequently went to Mass every day, and bring a computer geek, researched all the Eucharistic miracles known. It is quite a long list. Carlo contracted Leukaemia and died at 15 in 2006. He was beatified in Assisi last Saturday 10th October. Bishop Mark spoke about him at the Confirmation recently, as many of them were of a similar age.
