The CAFOD G7 Interfaith event 'Building a Better World after the Pandemic' held at Truro Cathedral on Thursday (10th June) was well attended and included speakers from several different faiths and denominations, including our own Bishop Mark as well as vulnerable indigenous people (via the internet) and a local young Christian student.

Fr Augusto Zampini-Davies, adjunct secretary of the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, talked about the Vatican's hope that the G7 countries will use their power responsibly to:

1. Enable all countries to access a COVID vaccine
2. Cancel third world debt
3. Urgently implement the Paris agreement in order to tackle climate change.

Bishop Mark spoke eloquently about the earth as our common home and the importance of fraternity, as set out in Pope Francis' encyclical "Fratelli Tutti". Speakers of all denominations and faiths, reiterated the importance of working together as a global community to tackle the causes of social and ecological injustice.
