COP26: As a Catholic community we have been given a very clear steer from Pope Francis about the importance of caring for our common home. In his 2015 encyclical **Laudato Si’**, His Holiness made it clear that ‘to harm the environment was to harm human beings.’ Furthermore, it asks us the key question, ‘What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children now growing up?’ The conference follows from a series of summits including the Paris 2015 talks where countries pledged to work together to keep the global temperature rise below 1.5c. If we exceed this threshold, millions of the most vulnerable people in our communities at home and abroad will be at risk of the devastating effects of climate change. In this respect, Pope Francis also makes the link that our current environments crisis represents a sociological crisis as well, with the effects of climate change disproportionately affecting the world’s poorest communities. Please pray that the leaders work together for positive outcomes for people and the planet.
