Lent begins this week, with Mass and Ashes on Wednesday 10 a.m. in church with the school, and at 7 p.m. with selections of Allegri's 'Miserere'. Hayle 12 noon.

Try to make a good start to Lent by being at Mass this day; and perhaps make time for an additional Mass during the week or Stations of the Cross on Fridays.

Stations of the Cross: Fridays: 10 a.m. St Ives: 10.30 after Mass Hayle; 6.00 p.m. Penzance.

Alleluia is the forbidden word in Lent, and is never used on whatever occasion during the 40 days until it returns at the Easter Vigil. The sung gospel acclamation in Lent is '**Praise to you O Christ, King of Eternal Glory**'.
