Research has taken me to the Roman Catholic section at Penzance Cemetery where is located the mass unmarked grave of these four young men. We are now fundraising from the Penlee Facebook page to purchase some form of memorial to mark their last resting place. I've also tracked down some family and the last surviving crew member of the Juan Ferrer - they are all supporting our appeal and hope to travel to Penzance in the next couple of months. I have also established that on the Friday morning after the wreck, four survivors of the shipwreck attended Solemn Requiem Mass at Penzance Roman Catholic Church for the eleven who had lost their lives. The Celebrant was Father S Hackett, newly appointed priest in charge at Penzance. On the following Monday morning Father Seamus Flynn blessed the coffins before they were placed in the hold of the coaster Ignacio Ferrer before being taken back to Bilbao. This sad story links us all together and I was wondering whether you could bring our fundraising efforts to the attention of your congregation. There is no doubt that we will achieve our goal and it would be really nice to have Penzance Roman Catholic Church working alongside us.
