Pope Francis will open the first session of the Synod on the 4th until 29th October. This gathering will be made up of Bishops and also of lay women and men, clergy and religious too. An important part of the preparations has been formed by a document 'Instrumentum Laboris.' You see this on www.vatican.va (it is quite long, but worth it) We are all called **to join in Prayer** as without prayer there will be no Synod. It is above all, an event of prayer and listening that involves not only those in Rome, but every baptised person joining in prayer and insistent invocation of the Holy Spirit to guide in discerning what the Lord is asking of his Church today. The Bidding Prayers this weekend we are asked to pray, and there is a special blessing at the end of Mass.
