**Epiphany House Blessing:** The custom is to mark with chalk the lintel above your front door, or a space nearby in the following way:

$$20+c+M+B+24$$

The year and the three crosses are easy to understand. The three letters either stand for the traditional names of the Wise Men (*Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar*) or the Latin *Christus mansionem benedicat* (*May Christ bless this home*) a prayer you can say as you mark the doorway with chalk.

Thanks a million to so many of you for the very glorious Christmas celebrations. Our churches were transformed from Advent so rapidly into Christmas by many helpers: cleaners, decorators, sacristans, crib builders, tree trimmers, flower arrangers, servers, musicians, and of course the wonderful music at both the Advent Carol Service and Midnight Mass. There were over 500 people between the 5 Masses. Thanks so much to all.

On a personal note, thanks as ever for your very great generosity in the Christmas Offering, plus the many cards with enclosures and gifts too. Fr David adds his thanks for cards and gifts. Thanks be to God for the wonderful gift of his Son, and thank you his lovely, great people.

**Christmas continues as there** are 40 days of rejoicing, so the Cribs will remain in our churches until Candlemas, The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple on Fri 2<sup>nd</sup> February. The trees too, can remain. The lights remind us to be like lights shining in our darkened world.

**Epiphany is a time to remind us of the liturgical year ahead.** The Holy Season of **Lent** will begin on Ash Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February and **Easter Sunday** is the 31<sup>st</sup> March. (The Easter Vigil on 30<sup>th</sup> will begin at 8 pm as the clocks spring forward after that on 31<sup>st</sup>) **Ascension** Thursday is 9<sup>th</sup> May and **Pentecost** 19<sup>th</sup> May.

White Flower Appeal. The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) hold the annual appeal next weekend 13/14th January. SPUC's vision is for a world where abortion is unthinkable. This year's appeal calls for the government to end the pills-by-post DIY abortion policy. As well as ending the lives of precious babies, this policy lacks safeguards against illegal late-term abortions, and puts mothers at physical and psychological risk. 86% of GP's are concerned that this scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion.
