My Day by Day. I know many of you like the daily readings and the June copies are here. I would be only too pleased to send a copy if you let me know either by phone or email.

Preparation for the Possible Reopening of Churches:

The health, safety and well-being of EVERYONE is paramount.

It is hoped that the opening of churches, for limited purposes, in the first instance will be possible towards mid-June. Gatherings will be for individual personal prayer, and will still be very restricted and in this initial phase, before the resumption of Public Acts of Worship, will preclude any timetabled service like the celebration of the Rosary or Adoration and Benediction, and nothing led publicly by a member of the clergy or by a lay person.

As the health and well-being of all our parishioners and visitors is paramount, we will need to introduce specific measures to ensure everyone's safety. More specific details will be issued in due course but, for now, we must assume that the 2 metre 'social distancing' rule will have to be applied, when we are opened for personal prayer.

We shall need volunteers to act as stewards to ensure social distancing measures are upheld and also cleaners, as churches will need to be cleaned fully, at least once a day, with attention especially given to areas that are frequently touched e.g. door handles. Volunteers at present should not be from groups considered to be 'vulnerable' under Government guidelines. It is worth bearing in mind that at least one steward will be required to be present in the church throughout the time it is open for prayer. It also means people will not be able to wander all over the building.

Since preparing this 4 more pages of guidance have come from the Bishops Conference, and it will be a nightmare. Plus the fact on local news yesterday, the 'R' is rising in the South West!

Live Organ Donation. *(to do with your bodies after death, not the instrument of music in church)*

You may already know that the law on donation of your organs after death has changed last month. Previously you had to give consent for this to happen. Now it will happen automatically unless you choose to opt out. To do that you have to register to say no. You can register on line, just google organ donation. Those without email etc. can write to: NHS Blood and Transplant.

Plymouth Catholic Children's Society.

In every country and community across the world, the coronavirus pandemic is turning children's lives upside down. We urgently need your help so that we can continue to support vulnerable children and their families throughout the Diocese. We have already secured some funding from the Devon Coronavirus Response & Recovery Fund and we have also set up a crowdfunding page. We hope to raise between £3,000 and £6,000 which would enable us to help at least 40 children directly (although more likely 80-100 family members would directly benefit). £6,000 would allow us to purchase for example: 10 children's beds/cots and mattresses - £1,000. 10 cookers - £2,000. 10 fridge/freezers - £1,500. 10 washing machines - £1,500
