A reminder of some of the practical suggestions from the Lent Study Course

As far as possible, try to keep a reverent and prayerful silence in church – avoid unnecessary chatter – in order to help you be more prayerful and to help those around you to pray.

Remember to genuflect as you enter and leave the church, and remember you are genuflecting to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle.

Appreciate the many gestures we make during Mass and what they signify: standing, kneeling, sitting, bowing during the Creed at the Incarnatus, and as we approach Holy Communion etc.

Remember to keep the Eucharistic Fast for 1 hour before Mass.
