COVID-19 Route Map Step 4 Guidance: 12 pages which we are still digesting, and as we know or should be aware, life is still very uncertain, so we. **PROCEED WITH CAUTION.** The main principle is that each parish should consider the prevailing local conditions, and with many visitors expected we should remain very much as we have been for the past few months. Many of you have expressed to me 'please keep us safe.', and so out of respect for each other, in the 4 churches across our parish we will continue to wear face coverings and the designated seating to enable this to be carried out safely. This will be essential as we phase back in our singing. Wearing masks for congregational singing isn't the most comfortable thing, but will help to control the spread of aerosols projected by this activity. Care must be taken to ensure everyone is, and feels safe.

HANDS – FACE – SPACE. A little relaxation maybe, but do be aware of the feelings of others.

Recommended Key Mitigating Actions against Virus transmission in Churches which should continue for the time being:

1. **Sanitising hands on entry**
2. **Ensuring people wear face coverings properly**
3. **Ventilation where ever possible**
4. **Good routine cleaning after Mass**
5. **Track and trace record**

Let us see how local conditions go on in the next few weeks. Maybe once the main holidays are over and the new school term begins we can assess further how we may move forward.

We hope our sacramental programmes for First Reconciliation and Holy Communion: Confirmation and RCIA can begin in mid-September.

North Aisle Building Works: As you can see. the roof is on. The latest big change in the church, covered by the plastic on the left, north side, is that after 178 years the temporary infill walls to the arches have gone! All now between us and the new build is the plastic sheeting, and thin boards. Obviously there will be some dust over the next few months, it also means that the weekday Masses there may be some noise from the builders. We cannot and must not stop the work, so Watch and Pray will be suspended until work is finished.
