Phase 1 building/restoration: the next part of this exciting development work continues. The new floors are now laid downstairs, to go to complete Phase 1 in time for the **great 175th anniversary Mass 26th October.**

Amongst its many activities, the Catenian Association supports young people aged between 16 and 25 who wish to spend a time, usually overseas, working with underprivileged people. It also gives grants to young people in the same age group who wish to go to Lourdes as carers. At its meeting in May, the Trustees awarded £22,100 to people applying for financial support with projects abroad and £35,550 to those applying for support as carers at Lourdes. In the last financial year grants given totalled £165,550 and in the past 7 years, £750,000 has been awarded. Organ Donation: Donation is a gift so don't presume consent (not church organs, yours!) The Bishop responsible for healthcare, Paul Mason, has said the Government's plans to introduce "opt-out" consent for organ and tissue donation in England "undermine the concept of donation as a gift., and cross the line of what is a reasonable action for the state to take in relation to individuals within it". He added that voluntary organ donation is an intrinsic good, but donation is a gift, and implementing such policy would lead to a slippery slope in terms of how the state rules it citizens.
