SPUC Pro-Life News: Rights for rivers, but not for unborn babies. A river in England is set to be given legal rights under the Universal Declaration of River Rights, as part of a global move to recognise the "inherent rights of rivers"

The rights of unborn children are still ignored.

SPUC also ask "**Will you help funding for forced abortions in China?**" Apparently millions of pounds of British taxpayers money is sent overseas to fund nations with tyrannical coercive abortion policies. Despite ending its infamous One Child Policy, forced abortions and sterilisations still occur in China -esp. among the Uyghurs. Sign the petition on 1/2 July.

Crib Monies:

Almost **£6,500** has been raised so far from 35 parishes who have kindly sent in their Crib collection monies, compared to **£6,088.19** from **38** parishes in 2021, **£3,080.91** in 2020 and **£5,349.77** in 2019. We are so grateful to every parish who continues to support us as we are still being overwhelmed with applications to our Essential Grants programme, as more and more families living in our Diocese are really struggling to pay for the basic essentials of life.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day is 15th. The abuse of older people is an increasing and serious problem, so it is vital to raise awareness of this to enable us all to take responsibility for preventing elder abuse in our communities. Elder abuse is a global issue and comes in many forms including physical, emotional, sexual and financial abuse and also neglect. A survey commissioned by the charity Hourglass in 2020 revealed 1 in 5 UK residents have personal experience of abuse as an older person or know someone who has been abused.
