This weekend is Prayer for Education. Pope Francis spoke about education recently. He is asking teachers to support pupils on their journey: *“You cannot educate without walking together with the people you are educating. It is beautiful when you find educators who walk together with boys and girls...to educate is not to say purely rhetorical things; to educate is to make what is said meet reality. Girls and boys have the right to make mistakes, but the educator accompanies them on the path...the true educator is never frightened by mistakes, no they listen, take them (the pupils) by the hand, listens, dialogues. They do not get frightened and waits. This is human education: to educate ‘is this bringing forward and promoting growth, helping to grow.”* We pray for all in education, and especially our parish school and all the staff and pupils

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday 18th September 2022 Celebrating the beauty of our Faith – calls us to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. “Evangelii Gaudium” is Latin for “Joy of the Gospel”. The day supports the work carried out by the Mission Directorate at the Bishops’ Conference in supporting our bishops in three important areas: Firstly, evangelisation and catechesis. Guided by the Bishops, this work supports the dioceses in bringing the beauty of the Catholic Faith to the people in their parishes, and to those who do not yet know the Lord.

Secondly, the beauty of the Liturgy and our church buildings. The Mission directorate ensures that liturgical directives from Rome are acted upon and liturgical texts are translated into English. Historical building experts work in the Directorate and support dioceses to fund and maintain beautiful places for prayer.

Thirdly, sharing the beauty of the Catholic faith with Christian and non-Christians through outreach and dialogue. This work supports the bishops at the national level and helps create greater understanding. The directorate also reaches out to those with no faith, but who seek the Lord “with a sincere heart”.
