During Lent Alleluia is forbidden at ALL Masses and Liturgies from Ash Wednesday until the Easter Vigil. No exceptions! The normal daily sung Gospel acclamation is **Praise to you O Christ, king of eternal glory.**

Reception of Holy Communion under both kinds. *The Bishops' Conference feels three years on from the first Covid lockdown, a suitable time to restore the chalice would be the start of the Triduum on Maundy Thursday. It is important to remember the totality of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of the Lord is received in either or both species. The choice of receiving from the chalice is for each communicant to make. They remind us too that intinction by the communicant is FORBIDDEN in England & Wales.*
