CAFOD/Sainsbury's & Fairtrade. Sainsbury's, the largest retailer of Fairtrade products in the world, last year decided to remove the Fairtrade mark from most of their own brand tea and to pilot their own 'fairly traded scheme instead. Cafod are concerned this could mean an unfair deal for poor farmers and producers. If you are a Sainsbury shopper, Cafod ask if you would hand in a letter asking the store to keep its commitment to Fairtrade. Letters to sign are in our churches, plus the accompanying letter re what it is all about.

The 9th World Meeting of Families is in Dublin from 21-26 August, and the chosen theme is 'The Gospel of the Family: Joy for the World.' Pope Francis will attend in the closing days. Joy is a theme of most of his documents: **Evangelii Gaudium** (The Joy of the Gospel) **Laudato Si** (Praise be to you, my Lord) **Amoris Laetitia** (The Joy of Love) and **Gaudete et Exsultate** (Rejoice and be glad).
