White Flower Appeal. The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) hold the annual appeal this weekend 13/14th January. SPUC's vision is for a world where abortion is unthinkable. This year's appeal calls for the government to end the pills-by-post DIY abortion policy. As well as ending the lives of precious babies, this policy lacks safeguards against illegal late-term abortions, and puts mothers at physical and psychological risk. 86% of GP's are concerned that this scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion.
