It would be good to read and discuss this, and I suggest the last two Tuesday evenings in May, 23rd and 30th at 7.30 p.m. in the Parish Hall Pz. This is open to any one across the parish, with constructive thoughts and ideas. We shall finish by 9, and close with some prayer time and Compline (Night Prayer).

Watch and Pray, time spent with Jesus in his Blessed Sacrament will begin again on Tuesday 23rd, after 12noon Mass until 4 p.m. Bishop Mark spoke in his letter of that two fold focus in our lives: one is to be ‘close to Jesus and deepen our love for him. An ideal opportunity for that.

Morning Prayer followed by Rosary will also begin again next week on Wednesdays and Fridays from 24th & 26th.
