'The Rest on the Flight into Egypt', by Harold Harvey, is available from the Aid to the Church in Need website shop. (https://acnuk.org/shop/)

Harvey, a convert and the only genuine Cornishman in the famous Newlyn School of artists, painted this beautiful image of the Holy Family in 1927. The Christ Child gives His blessing from the harbour wall, the signpost is the Cross, the inn is the Lamb and Flag and the background to Our Lady and Joseph are the hills of Penwith. The image is available courtesy of the Trustees and all revenues go to the wonderful work of ACN. It was the wish of the late Rachel John, Catholic Historian and Cornish Bard, that this converting image be as widely known as possible and each of our church schools has a copy.
