The Government's **abortion amendments will be debated on Tuesday 4 June.**

A reminder that the extreme abortion decriminalisation amendments we need to defeat are New Clause 1 by Diana Johnson, and New Clause 40 by Stella Creasy. Amendments on lowering the time limit (NC15) and on banning late abortions for babies with Down's syndrome (NC41) will also be debated.

This week, it has been announced that another amendment, NC115, has been tabled, which would mandate a return to face to face appointments before women are given abortion pills. [End DIY Abortion: Justice for Baby Lily Campaign.](#)
