Holy Land Pilgrimage: following last weekend's homily, do be reassured we did have a good pilgrimage. A few early days were spent in the Palestine hills. One thing that is very noticeable is the extraordinary terrain. We land at Tel Aviv, at sea level on the Mediterranean coast, but Jerusalem is not far off 3000 ft. **above sea level.** The desert land, and the road from Jerusalem to Jericho leads near to the Dead Sea which is 1,380 ft **below sea level,** the lowest point on earth. The Judean hills and desert, how they walked in Jesus day! The first rain they had had since April came on 31st October. Only 1 other day of rain for us on Mount Tabor, Mt. of Transfiguration. They didn't blame us for it, as they were crying out for it, but said, 'you'll feel at home!' We did visit the main sites in Jerusalem and Bethlehem. Also the birth place of John the Baptist, Emmaus, The Ark of the Covenant Church. Renewed baptism vows in the river Jordan, the married renewed vows in Cana, Nazareth and Mary's spring; Capernaum, Loaves & fishes church, Mount of Beatitudes, a boat on Sea of Galilee, and Magdala, home of Mary Magdalen. Our final stay was on Mount Carmel, with the Carmelites where Elijah's cave is. Archbishop Mark had invited David to go and lead the music, so we had some very uplifting Masses at the various sites. As I said in the homily Christians are in persecution, and what became very clear was we need not worry about the Church. **Our greatest task is to bring others to know Christ. Mission is what we should all be about.**
