The Feast of Christ the King marks the end of the Liturgical year. Pope Pius XI instituted the feast in 1925, at the close of the Jubilee Year, to celebrate the all-embracing authority of Christ which shall lead all humanity to seek the 'peace of Christ' in the 'Kingdom of Christ.' He was elected in 1922, following the unexpected death of Benedict XV aged 67 of influenza that developed into pneumonia. Pius' motto on election was "Christ's peace in Christ's kingdom." interpreting it as meaning that the church and Christianity should be active in, and not insulated from, society. The feast was a counter to contemporary secularism, totalitarianism and rising fascism. The feast widens our horizons to see life and authority in the perspective of eternity.

Pope Francis' Prayer for Protection during the Coronavirus Pandemic. O Mary, You shine continuously

on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick. At the foot of the cross, you participated in Jesus' pain, with steadfast faith. You, Salvation of the Roman people, know what we need. We are certain that you will provide, so that as at Cana in Galilee, joy and feasting might return after this time of trial. Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform ourselves to the Father's will and to do what Jesus tells us: He who took our sufferings upon Himself, and bore our sorrows to bring us, through the Cross, to the joy of the Resurrection. **Amen.** We seek refuge under your protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our pleas –we who are put to the test -and deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin.

My dear people, we continue to share together the distress and anguish of lockdown, and our churches closed for public worship. The reality of opening for private prayer which requires stewards present at all times during the opening, and a cleaning after each time, is not viable in our situation. As previously no one should enter the building at any time.

Please continue the time of prayer with people of all faiths at 6 p.m. daily, for an end to the pandemic.

(I ring the bell for the Angelus each day at 6 p.m.)

Saints this week:

St Andrew Dung-Lac and companions. There are 117 martyrs in this group, and although they died at different times, they were all canonised by Pope St John Paul II in 1988. Of the group 96 were Vietnamese, 11 were Spaniards, and 10 were French. There were 8 bishops, 50 priests and 59 lay Catholics in the group. The Opening prayer of the Mass calls upon God, the origin and source of all fatherhood, who made Andrew and companions faithful to Christ even to the shedding of their blood. The tortures endured by these martyrs were indescribable but, as St Cyprian says, the martyrs were stronger than their tortures. The significance of the feast of these martyrs can be found in the words of Pope St John Paul II in his homily at the canonisation. After emphasizing that these martyrs were all obedient to civil authority in matter that were right and just, the Holy Father stated that in the face of the restrictions on the practice of the faith, they protested that they could not abandon their Christian religion and thereby disobey the supreme authority of God. Through the witness of these martyrs, said the Holy Father, the Church in Vietnam has proclaimed that it will not reject the cultural traditions and lawful institutions of the country but wants to be inculturated and thus contribute to the upbuilding of the entire country. This applies to Catholics in every country, who should strive to reconcile their cultural traditions and national loyalty with their life as Christians

St Catherine of Alexandria, (25th) is no longer in the General Calendar, but I know a few are named after her. Tradition is that she was a virgin, of noble family, of exceptional learning, and who, as a result of her protest against the persecution of Christians, was tied to a wheel, tortured and beheaded. The 'Catherine wheel' her symbol.
