During Lent Alleluia is forbidden at all Masses and Liturgies from Ash Wednesday until the Easter Vigil. No exceptions! The normal daily sung Gospel acclamation is Praise to you O Christ, king of eternal glory.

Caritas Lent: 'Faith without works is dead' James 2:14
During this Lent, Caritas challenges YOU to keep it simple and do little acts each week that will make a positive difference in the lives of those around you. We are also

reminded by the Bishop's Conference, to observe the abstinence of meat on Fridy to mark the weekly day of penance. Those who do not eat meat, should give up a different food that they usually eat. We have created suggestions for each week of Lent. How many of these actions can you complete?

Lent: Week 2 Give up a small luxury during Lent and use the money you save to help others. Pray for those around the world, particularly refugees, who are making a fresh start. Observe meat free Friday.
