This Sunday is the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, a celebration of God, revealed to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Next Weekend is the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus et Sanguis Christi) It is at the Masses this weekend that Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion renew their commitment to ministry. You can renew at whichever church/Mass you are at that weekend, as of course we are one united parish.

This weekend is the retiring collection for the Plymouth Secular Clergy Fund, for the sick and retired priests. I know our retired, and those retiring and the sick clergy are always very grateful for your generosity.

We shall soon have **Canon David Annear** retiring from Launceston, Bude and Callington coming to live in one of the St Mary's Old School Apartments. We look forward to welcoming him later in the summer.

The First Holy Communion for our children will be at the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday 10th June. Please keep them and their parents and sponsors in your prayers.

175th Window Project: You can see more pictures from the factory of work in progress making the windows. One of them has about 900 pieces of glass. Safeguarding. Many of our ministers, especially those who go out with the Blessed Sacrament: those working with the Children's Liturgy group, and anyone visiting on behalf of the parish, need to have their DBS (used to be CRB) renewed. This is vital. The team from the Diocesan Safeguarding Office will be here in the Presbytery on Friday 15th June from 3 – 5 p.m. for you to bring in your identification for verification. Ministers will be notified by them about all this.

Music & Arts Festival Week: what a glorious week from every angle; the weather was good and the sun lit up the church to show it in all its beauty, greatly advanced with the stunning floral displays in the Sanctuary, the other arrangements at the entrance, the Font, the statues, and 'the journey of life;' the art and craft works; paintings; the beautiful Icons; pottery from Humphry Davy School; the art and collages from each class of our own St Mary's Catholic School, and a lovely display by our Children's Liturgy Group. The outstanding standard of all our concerts, from the amazing organ recital by Martin Baker of Westminster Cathedral; the one Schubert String Quartet No 10 lasting over an hour played by the Corineus Quartet: the lovely candlelit Baroque concert played on early instruments by the Heinichen Ensemble, and who always educate us about the Early Music composers. The variety of English Church music from the Girl choristers and Lay Clerks of Truro Cathedral, to the amazing Marian Consort giving us church music of Palestrina, Victoria, Gabriel Jackson & James MacMillan, with an utterly spiritual uplifting Allegri 'Miserere,' with two groups of singers in different parts of the church and the Plainsong cantor in the organ gallery, with soaring top 'C's' and then coming down to Cornish earth with our old friends; the Mousehole Male Voice Choir. The week also gave us the opportunity to use the newly created Sacristy Corridor and the new indoor toilets. The delicious extravaganza lunch following the Festival Mass launched the week, and Cheese and Wine, following Vespers and Benediction brought it to a fitting close. As you know the driving force and inspiration behind it all is David Gridley, tremendous thanks to him, the Gaudete Choir Association, and the many volunteers who helped the week to run so smoothly. The Hymn we chose as the theme in this 175th anniversary year was "In our day of thanksgiving," which reminds us of past priests, worshippers, benefactors and parishioners, all coming together to praise God for his goodness to us.
