All Saints Day is a holy day, so we all ought to try and be at Mass (and counteract some of the nonsense of Hallowe'en) All Masses this year will be said).

All Saints and All Souls: “Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes?” In November we remember all those who have died and gone before us, marked with the sign of faith. Tuesday is **All Saints** day, so all the saints in heaven, and Wednesday is **All Souls**, all those still making their way into glory, the faithful departed.. We believe that the Church exists here on earth (**the Church Militant**) in purgatory (**the Church Expectant**, and remember purgatory is part of heaven, not hell) and in heaven (**the Church Triumphant**) We may be in three different ‘places’ but we are all part of the one mystical body of Christ. All Saints, celebrates all those who have journeyed along the same path as us, but are further ahead in heaven. Our readings on this day give us a glimpse of the reality of heaven. St Matthew speaks of the beautiful attitudes of those who will be given admittance. St John in his Letter reminds of the love the Father has, and continues to lavish upon us. In Apocalypse (Revelation) St John gives us a clear image. This book, the last in the Bible is unique amongst the books of the bible because it is the only one which hasn’t happened yet – all the others are historical, but this is prophetic telling us in signs and wondrous language what is to come. In his vision John tells us it was the Lord’s Day, and he is caught up with a vision of the worship of heaven. It is why so much of what we do at Mass is all there in this book, for the Mass is heaven on earth. So when John sees a great multitude in white robes, standing round the Throne of the Lamb, he is seeing us. If we stood where he is standing, and if our eyesight was good enough to pick out individual faces, we would be able to see ourselves (we pray) and all those we have known and loved, glorious in heaven at the end of time, standing around God’s throne. This is the ultimate reality of our life’s journey, and a cause of our great rejoicing. Let us rejoice in his angels and saints.

All Souls day we pray for our dead. In the same communion of Saints, we offer our prayers for the Holy Souls in purgatory, those who, in the words of **Benedict XVI** are in the *inward process of transformation in which a person becomes capable of Christ*. As **St John Fisher** (Bishop of Rochester, martyred 1535) said about the Holy Souls:

‘They are of the same faith hope and charity as us. They are partners in the same sacraments, but there are also the natural ties of affection, kinship and obligation, Every one of us has some of his or her friends and family there, therefore we must act like friends, let us be loving towards them now just as we claimed to love them when they were still with us here on earth.’
